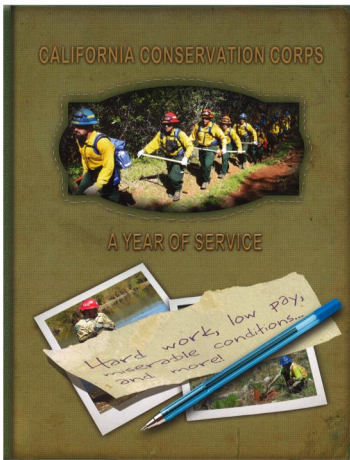

FAMILY WRAP

Probation and Child Welfare Services contract with Redwood Community Services (RCS) for this program. For Probation referred youth and families, this program is intended to last 90 to 120 days and assist the family with a variety of issues included homelessness, family conflict, and a referral for services. The family creates a family team and has the assistance of a Care Coordinator who leads the team, a skills coach which provides one-on-one assistance to the youth, and a parent partner that works one-on-one with the parents. The program was implemented in March of 2015. In the 2 years since the program started, more than 90 families in Lake County have received assistance.

In January, Deputy Probation Officer Kevin O'Brien conducted training on Child Family Teams for a variety of our partner agencies at Mendocino College. Child Family Teams (CFT) are part of the Continuum of Care Reform. Deputy Probation Officers act as facilitators for CFTs for children placed in foster homes and group homes when placement decisions are made and every 90 days while a child is in placement.
